Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Marcey Fountain, former collector of taxes for Caroline county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment; which was read and assented to:

At the end of the bill add:

'Provided, that no lands and tenements which have been sold shall in any manner, or the tenant occupying the same, be answerable or liable for taxes assessed previous to said sale or transfer.'

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act for appointing commissioners for the town of Oxford, in Talbot county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments; which were read and assented to:

In the 7th line of the preamble strike out the word 'now' and insert 'non.'

In the 2d line of the enacting clause after the name 'Martin' insert the word 'junior.'
