Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the promotion of internal improvement; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled, an act for the protection of oysters in the waters of the eastern shore of this state; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Emory, Page and Hughlett.

- A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an additional act relating to the city of Baltimore, passed at December session 1830, chapter 139; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Montgomery and Claude.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Prince George's county to record the deed therein mentioned; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on invalid deeds.

Also resolutions recommending Henry Clay for the Presidency of the United States and John Sergeant for the Vice Presidency: which were read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Claude, the rule directing the reference of all bills resolutions &c. from the house of delegates to one of the standing committees or a select committee was dispensed with so far as relates to said resolutions.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which the petition was referred, reported a bill entitled, an act for opening and increasing the width of German Lane in the city of Baltimore; which was read the first, and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
