Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for an alteration in the constitution, so as to enlarge the number of election districts in Baltimore county, and fix the places of voting, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ough to pass with the following amendment; which were read and assented to.

In the 2nd. line of the 3rd. section, after the word "and"

insert the word "made"

In the 4th line of the same section, strike out the words 'at their discretion' and insert the words 'and they are hereby directed and required.'

The bill was then read the second time.

The resolution relating to the states claim to certain land in Harford county, was read the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr Mayer from the committee on finance to which was referred a resolution in favor of William Riley and others;

reported favourably thereon.

It was then read the second, and by special order the third time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Pigman from the committee on insolvency, to which was referred the petition of Thomas B. Gordon, reported,
