

children of James Dew, formerly of Caroline county, deceased; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs Dennis, Emory and Hughlett.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act for regulating and inspecting weights and measures used in this state; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs Montgomery, Hughlett and Osborn.

A bill entitled an act for the relief of Isaac Hooper, former collector of Calvert county; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on insolvency.

A bill entitled, an act relating to judgments and decrees obtained in the several courts of this state; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the resolution in favor of William C. Conine, was read the third time, by special order, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

The resolution for the relief of Charles S. Davis, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Claude, the resolutions recommending Henry Clay for the Presidency and John Sergeant for the Vice Presidency of the United States; was read the second, and by special order the third time, and unanimously assented to.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, the senate proceeded to the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Warren Manufacturing Company, passed at December session 1830, chapter 71.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following amendment was read.

At the end of the bill, add the following section.

“And be it enacted, That no part of this act shall be of any effect, unless such part be accepted by all of the corporators, and that any part thereof, may be so accepted and have the same effect as the act to which this is a supplement; provided that such acceptance be shewn under the signatures of all the corporators.”

The question was put,

‘Will the senate assent to the said amendment?’

And it was determined in the negative.
