

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Wootton leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to incorporate the Annapolis Rail Road Company.

Ordered, That the committee on internal improvement prepare and report the same.

Mr. Wootton from the said committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Annapolis Rail Road Company, which was read the first time.

The bill, entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate the Baltimore Life Insurance Company, was read the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following resolutions.

A resolution in favor of Lieut. Arnold Jacobs, which were severally read the first time, and referred to the committee on Militia.

And a resolution relative to the opening a safe and direct navigation, through the sounds which run parallel with the sea coast, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on internal improvement.
