

Ordered, that the senate will proceed at 12 o'clock this day to the election of a director for the Bank of Baltimore.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to fix the compensation of judges and clerks of elections in and for Worcester county, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act relating to judgments and decrees obtained in the several courts of this state, reported, that the committee had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

The bill was then read the second time.

Mr. Dennis submitted the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,

March 5, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We return you the following bills, that is to say, An act to authorise the clerk of Dorchester county court, to record a deed from John Ashcom Traverse, to Henry Keene. An act to authorise the clerk of Washington county court to record the deed therein mentioned. An act to authorise the clerk of Harford county to record the deed therein mentioned. An act to authorise the recording of a deed therein mentioned. An act to authorise the clerk of Prince George's county, to record the deed therein mentioned. An act to make valid a deed from Abel Pearson and wife, to John Andrews, severally rejected, having already passed a general law, which provides for all cases of a similar nature.
