

The bill was then read through the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for marking and bounding land, passed at November session, 1786, as relates to Saint Mary's county, was read the third time and passed and sent to the house of delegates

12 o'clock having arrived, on motion of Mr. Claude, the following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, That Wiltiam Dickinson, be and he is hereby appointed director on the part of the state of the bank of Baltimore.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to revive and extend the charter of the Planter's Bank of Prince George's county, so as to enable that institution gradually to wind up its affairs, was read the third time as proposed to be amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the register of wills of Saint Mary's county to record certain papers destroyed by fire, and for other purposes, was read the third time as proposed to be amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to the states claim on the government of the United States; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Finance.

Also a resolution in favor of James Harvey; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mntgomery, Sappington and Pigman.

Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate elections, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, and amended,

On motion of Mr Wootton, by adding at the end of the bill the following words "to be levied and paid as other county charges are."

The question was then put, "shall the bill pass?"

It was determined in the affirmative and the bill returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr Mayer, the resolution relative to digested index of the Maryland reports, was read the third time, by special order, and the question was put, "will the senate assent to said resolutions?"
