The yeas and nays having been asked for, was taken and appeared as follows:

And the resolution returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Montgomery from the committee to which was referred the resolution in favor of James Harvy, reported favorable thereon.

It was then read the second and by special order the third. time assented to and returned to the house of detegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill to incorporate the Mechanic's Savings Fund Society of Baltimore, reported favorily thereon.

The bill was then read the second time, and on motion of Mr. Wootton, it was made the order of the day for to-morrow (Tuesday) the 6th inst.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimere and Port De Posit Rail Road Company, passed by the senate on Saturday with sundry amendments was re-considered; and

On motion of Mr. Montgomery, the following amendments in addition to those heretofore assented to, were read and assented to.

In the 7th line of 13th section, after the word "property" insert the words "other than guaries, and warehouses."

In the 8th line of the same section, strike out words "such land or materials" and insert the words "the same."

In the 14th line after the word "materials," insert the words "as before described."

The bill was then read the third time, passed returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution in favor of John Hepburn, reported that the committee had had said resolution under considera-. tion and were of opinion it ought not to pass, it was then read the second time.
