Amend the title of the bill by adding the words "passed at December session 1825, chapter 65"

The question was then put, "shall the bill be engrossed for a third reading?" and it was determined in the affirmative, and accordingly engrossed.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, it was read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Claude, leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to provide for the public printing of this state. Ordered, that Messrs. Claude, Mayer and Wootton be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The bill entitled an act relating to insolvent debtors, being entitled to a third reading was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following amendment was read and assented to:

Add the following as an additional section:

"And be it enacted, That the act passed at December session of the year 1830, chapter 124, be and the same is hereby declared to extend to costs in all cases of fines imposed in any criminal proceedings."

The bill was then read through, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
