

In the 18th line of the same section, strike out the word "three," and insert the word "four."

In the same line strike out the word "nine," and insert "twelve."

In the 17th line of the 19th section, strike out the words "along or near to."

The resolution in favor of Catharine Grove,

The resolution in favor of Sarah White, and

The resolution in favor of Mrs. Mary C. Schryer, were read the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Wootton from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate a company to improve the navigation of Queen's Town creek, in Queen Ann's county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not pass.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Wootton submitted the following message, which was read and adopted.

By the Senate,

March 6, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have examined the bill originated in your house, to incorporate a company for the improvement of the navigation of Queen's town creek, and we think this bill should pass, provided an amendment be made, that the instalments on the shares subscribed for by the state, shall not be paid by the treasurer until it shall be ascertained by the certificate of the president and directors of the said company, that the instalments as called for, have been paid by the individual stockholders, or in default thereof, that their shares have been forfeited and sold according to the provisions of this bill. This bill being a money bill, we do not deem it within the power of the senate to amend it, and we return it to you for amendment.
