And be it enacted. That the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Roats Company shall furnishin writing, to the treasurer of the westerp shore of Marylands a full and fair statement of the amount of monies received by them, and the particular manner in which. such monies have been appropriated; and unless such statement is furnished under the oath or affirmation of the president and secretary of said company, giving a full and specific account of such expenditure, together with the assent of the -said Ballimore and Obio rail road company, to furnish in writing annually to the said treasurer, an exact statement of the expenditure of their funds and the condition of said company, nothing in this act shall be, or construed to be of any force. or effect.

And he it enacted, That the said Baltimore and Ohio rait road company. at any time hereafter, when the Chesapeakeand Ohio canal company, shall give it's consent, shall make, form and construct a basin and safe harbor for boats, at the Point of Rocks or any other suitable place along the canal, to facilitate the removal of the canal commerce, from the canal boats to the rail road cars.
