diction of the county courts of the first judicial district of Maryland; which was read the first, and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr Mayer from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act to regulate the inspection of tobacco; which was read the first time.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the the petition of Elizabeth Wilson, reported a bili entitled, an act to divorce Elizabeth Wilson, from her husband James Wilson of the city of Baltimore; which was read the first and by special order the second time and the question was put, "shall the bill be engrossed for a third reading, and it was determined in the negative, so the bill was rejected.

The bill entitled an act to incorporate the Maryland state colonization society, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to the city of Baltimore, passed at December session 1830, chapter 139, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment; which was read and assented to.

In the 3rd line of the 2nd section after the word "a-mounts," insert the words "not exceeding one million of

dollars.3

The bili was then read the second, and by special order

the third time and passed.

The bill entitled, an act to sr etrain the use of spirituous liquors, being entitled to a second reading, was taken up for consideration, and whilst pregressing in the reading,

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following amendments were

read and assented to.

In the 11th line of the 3rds ection after the word "licenses" insert the words "for sale by the clerks of Baltimore city and county courts."

At the end of the 3rd section add;

And it shall not be lawful for any person or persons without a licence issued asaforesaid, to sell any spirituous liquors within the city of Baltimore or Baltimore county, within the limits of said city."

The bill was then read through the second time.
