Strike out the following words in the 7th line after the word "esquires" "add the like number of the laws after they shall have been acted on by the legislature"

The resolution was then read the second, and by special order the third time and assented to.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Mann of the city of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

It was then read the second, and by special order the third time and passed.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the recovery of small debts, was read the third time, and

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following amendment was read and assented to.

Add the following as an additional section.

"And be it enacted that the 1st section of this act be, and the same is hereby declared to apply only to Baltimore county"

The question was then put "shall the bill pass?" and it was determined in the affirmative.
