at November session 1789, chapter 15; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Emory, Dennis and Hügh-lett.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the repair of a bridge in Baltimore county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Sappington and Hughlett.

A bill entitled, an act to provide for opening and extending Fayette street, in the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Montgomery and Pigman.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Port Tobacco Savings Bank; which was read the first time and referred

to Messrs. Hughlett, Claude and Sappington.

The bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas B. Gordon, of the city of Balti-

more, was returned endorsed 'will pass.'

The bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, was returned endorsed will rass with the proposed amendments.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the said amendments, which were as follows, were referred to the committee on judicial

proceedings.

1st. Strike out from the word 'conveyance' in the 14th line of the 3d section to the end of the section.

2d. Strike out the 4th section.

3d. Strike out the 6th, 7th and 8th sections.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on invalid deeds to which was referred a bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed from Grafton Duvall and Elizabeth W. Duvall, his wife, to Alexander Thomas Hawkins Duvall, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments; which was read and assented to:

Amendments Proposed.
