

tion aforesaid to receive or accept of any of its own shares of stock in payment of any debts, and if any share or shares are so accepted, then and in such case the charter hereby granted shall immediately thereupon be forfeited, and each director consenting to such acceptance, shall forfeit for each share he consents to accept the sum of fifty dollars, the one half to the informer, the other half to the state, to be recovered on indictment and conviction of the party accused in the county court of the county wherein the banking house of said institution is situated.
