

Washington County Bank at the town of Williamsport, in Washington county, endorsed 'will pass.'

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Elizabeth Stewart, of the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to

At the end of the bill add:

"And the said Elizabeth Stewart shall to every effect, interest and purpose be capable in law and equity to take, hold and dispose of any property, and make and be bound by any contracts and agreements, as if she were a *feme sole* and had never been married; provided however, that nothing herein contained shall authorise the said Elizabeth to contract marriage during the life of the said Joseph Stewart."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee on Finance, to which was referred a bill entitled, an act in favor of Nancy and Lloyd Stallings, reported favorably thereon.

It was then read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Emory from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to enable John Cummings of the state of Delaware to remove a negro out of this state in whom he possesses an unexpired term; reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to.

In the 3rd line of the 1st section, after the word 'Rachel,' insert the words 'into the state of Delaware.'

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Emory from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Queen Anne's county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion ought not to pass.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.
