

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the senate proceeded to the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the governor and council of the state of Maryland to appoint the inspectors of flour for this state, passed at December session 1825, chapter 174.

The said bill was progressing in the third reading, when

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following amendments were read and assented to:

Strike out the 3<sup>d</sup> section, and in lieu thereof insert:

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the assistant inspectors shall at the end of every month pay over with an account under oath to the general inspector all monies received by them for their services as inspectors or for charges of inspecting under the act to which this is a supplement, or under any other act or ordinance whatsoever, and the said general inspector shall monthly divide in equal portions among the said inspectors, and the said general inspector the amounts so received by him; and in like manner the said general inspector shall quarterly divide in equal portions among said assistant inspectors and said general inspectors the proceeds of the drawings of flour hereinafter authorised to be sold by said general inspector."

2. 8<sup>th</sup> line 10<sup>th</sup> section after the word "advantageous" strike out the rest of the section.

3. Sec. 11. After the enacting clause, strike out to the word "and" inclusive, and insert "that."

4. 11<sup>th</sup> sec. 12<sup>th</sup> line, after the word "compensation" strike out to the end of the sec and insert for the monies provided to be divided by the general inspector as aforesaid among the assistant inspectors and said general inspectors for their compensation, and to such portion of such monies as such assistant inspector would have been entitled to for the time of his suspension if he had not been so suspended.

5. At the end of the bill add:

'Sec. 4 And be it enacted, That it shall not hereafter be lawful for the governor and council to appoint any other inspector or inspectors of flour for the city of Baltimore other than those provided for by this act, and that the three inspectors already appointed shall in all respects act and be deemed to be appointed as inspectors of flour in the said city under this act, from the time of the appointment of a fourth inspector, until the next annual appointment, on the
