The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas F. Wormal of Saint Mary's county, was reconsidered and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Mayer and Hughlett.

Also the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of Robert C. Lushy,

And a resolution in favor of Joshua Sedwick, which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

A resolution in favor of Marsham Queen of Charles county, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Joseph Harvey from his wife Rebecca C. Harvey, was read the third time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Claude, the bill entitled, an act to divorce Jane Freeman of the city of Annapolis, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act to facilitate the collection and to improve the revenue of this state, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate such elections, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Page, Sappington and Claude.

Mr. Page from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the revaluation of real and personal property in Dorchester county, reported favorably thereon.
