

SATURDAY, March 10, 1832.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the grade of the square of Washington Monument in the city of Baltimore, passed by the senate on yesterday was sent; and

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to the opening of Bottle Alley in the city of Baltimore and for other purposes.

And the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Cecil county rail road, also severally passed by the senate on yesterday, were returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Page submitted the following order which was read and adopted.

Ordered, that the senate proceed to fill the vacancy created in the senate by the lamented death of our fellow senator, Octavias C. Taney Esquire, of Calvert county.

The senate accordingly proceeded to fill the said vacancy.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, John B. Morris Esquire, was put in nomination.

The ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, and on examination thereof by the clerk, it appeared there had been twelve votes taken, all of which were given for John B. Morris Esq.

Whereupon it was declared that John B. Morris Esquire, is duly elected a senator for the Wester Shore, for and during the term prescribed by the constitution and form of government.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the bill entitled, an act to facilitate the collection and improve the revenue of this state, was recommitted to the committee on finance.

The bill entitled, an act regulating the admission of attorneys to practice law in any of the courts of this state, was read the third time as proposed to be amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr Pigman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act authorising the commissioners of Allegany county to cause to be built a bridge over Will's
