

The bill was then read through the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for quieting possessious, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, being entitled to a second reading, was taken up for consideration, and whilst progressing in the reading,

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following amendment was read and dissented from.

In the 29th line of the bill after the word 'acknowledgments' insert as follows:

'Provided, that the said justices of the peace as to all deeds hereafter to be executed and acknowledged shall appear before said clerk or prothonotary and acknowledge the certificate of acknowledgment aforesaid to be their act, and that the said clerk or prothonotary shall in his certificate set forth the fact of such appearance and acknowledgment of the justices of the peace.'

On motion of Mr. Pigman, the following amendments were read and assented to.

In the 2nd line of the bill, strike out the word "hereafter."

In the 31st line of the bill, strike out the word "twelve" and insert the word "six."

The bill was then read though the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly, respecting elections and to regulate such elections, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then read the second time, and on motion of Mr. Sappington, it was made the order of the day for Monday next the 12th inst.

The report and resolutions relative to the Southern and Western limits of this state, were read a second time and the question was put, "shall the said report and resolutions be engrossed for a third reading?"

And it was determined in the affirmative.
