MONDAY, March 12th, 1832.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act passed at November session 1804, chapter 55, entitled, an act to provide for the trial of facts in the several counties of this state, and to alter, change and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the general court and court of appeals, passed by the senate on Saturday,

And the report and resolutions relative to the southern and evestern limits of this state, also assented to by the senate on Saturday, were sent,

And the resolution in favor of William Caton,

And the resolution relative to the digested index of the Maryland Reports, also severally assented to by the senate on Saturday,

And the bill entitled, an act authorising the recording of a deed from Magdalena Seibert and Jacob Seibert to Samuel Bentz, of Washington county,

The bil entitled, an act to authorise the recording of certain deeds therein mentioned for the benefit of John Nor-

And the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Marsham Queen, of Charles county, severally rejected by the senate on Saturday,

And the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Mary Pearce, of Anne Arundel county,

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to au act to amend the lottery system,

And the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act concerning crimes and punishments, severally passed by the senate on Saturday last with sundry amendments, were returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to provide for the more complete administration of justice in equity cases in Allegany county.

Ordered, That the committee on judicial proceedings prepare and report the same.

Mr. Pigman from the said committee reported a bill enti-
