

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions.

A bill entitled, an act for the revaluation and reassessment of the real and personal property in Prince George's county, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Morris and Dennis.

And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act relating to recording deeds, endorsed 'will pass.'

Also a bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Commercial Bank of Millington in Kent county, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments.'

The said amendments, which were as follows, were read and assented to.

In the 20th line of the 2d section strike out 'Samuel B. Turner' and insert 'Jesse Knock.'

In the 22d line between the names of 'Richard Ringgold' and 'Peregrine Wilmer,' strike out the word 'and' and insert 'Peregrine Grauger.'

In the same line after the name of 'Peregrine Wilmer' insert 'and John M'Kenny.'

Also the report and resolutions which originated in the senate, relative to the southern and western limits of this state, endorsed 'assented to.'

And a resolution in favor of Marsham Queen, of Charles county, reported favorably thereon.

They were then read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.
