

to such other justice as may entertain any proceedings as aforesaid on such bond.'

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to extend real estate, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer submitted the following report and resolutions, which were read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

The joint committee on the public printing report,

That in compliance with the provisions of the act passed at the present session on that subject, they have contracted with Wm M'Neir to execute the printing which may be required by the senate, and with Jerh. Hughes to execute the printing which may be required by the house of delegates for the ensuing year.

The terms on which they have contracted with them respectively are the same with those on which the printing of the present session has been executed; that is to say,

For bills 111 copies, one dollar per page.

For documents and pamphlets, plain, 111 copies \$1 per page,

For broadsides, 111 copies, \$8

Journals 1600 copies, per page, \$2

Laws 1600 copies, per page, \$2 50

The work and paper not to be inferior to that of the present session. The committee also recommend the passage of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the governor and council be, and they are hereby authorised to settle the accounts of Jerh. Hughes and William M'Neir for printing the laws and journals so soon after each session as they shall respectively deliver the copies contracted for according to the foregoing terms.
