Mr. Chapman from the committee on finance to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the payment of the journal of accounts, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order

the third time and passed.

The hill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, was taken up for consideration.

The amendments heretofore reported were read and assented to.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the fol-

lowing message:

By the House of Delegates, March 13th, 1832.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message proposing to invite the governor to sign and seal the laws at five o'clock this evening, and proposing to close the present session of the legislature on to-morrow at 12 o'clock, and concurn therein. . By order,

Also a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to promote internal improvement by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to the city of Washington, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on

Also a resolution relative to paying the funeral expenses of Doctor Taney, which was read the first time and refer-

red to the committee on finance.

Also a report and resolution relative to the public print-

ing, which was read the first time.

Mr, Wootton from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the preamble and resolutions relative to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, reported favorably thereon.

They were then read the second time. The senate adjourned until 4 o'clock, P. M.
