Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred, the bill entitled, an act to widen a part of Gay street, formerly Bridge street in the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment which was read and assented to.

At the end of the bill add,

“And provided that by ordinance to be passed in relation to this act, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, shall provide for a trial by jury in all cases of damage or benefit.”
