

granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly relating to elections, and to regulate such elections which was read the first time.

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Henrietta T. Stewart of the city of Baltimore, from her husband James Stewart, was read the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of a weigher of wheat in the city of Baltimore and prescribing his duties, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then progressing in the second reading, when on motion of Mr. Emory, the following amendment was read and assented to.

In the 12th line of the 3rd section, strike out "one cent" and insert "two cents"

The bill was then read through the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of William McNeir, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

And returned the bill which originated in the the senate, entitled an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning powers of attorney from heirs and legatees and of releases and find, discharges to executors, administrators and guardians endorsed "will pass."

The clerk of the house of delegate returned the engrossed bills of the senate from No. 191 to No. 209 endorsed, "read and assented to."

And delivered the engrossed bills of the house of delegates from No. 96 to No. 199 and from No 210 to No. 227, which were severally read assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

The speaker and members of the house of delegater appeared in the senate chamber, when his Excellency, Governor Howard signed the engrossed bills from No. 96 to No. 227 inclusive, in the presance of both houses of the General Assembly according to the provisions of the onstitution and form of government.
