WEDNESDAY, March 14, 1832.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday except Mr. Page.

The bill entitled, an act for the payment of the journal of accounts,

And the bill entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, severally passed by the senate on yesterday, the last with an amendment, were returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act to incorporate Sam's Creek Rail Road Company, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act to restrain private banking, endorsed 'will pass.'

Also the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province, and limiting the extent of them, endorsed 'will not pass.'

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, the resolution in favor of Dr. Thomas Tillotson was read the third time by special order, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Elkton and Baltimore Rail Road Company, being entitled to a third reading, was taken up for consideration, and whilst progressing in the reading,

On motion of Mr. Montgomery, the following amendments were read and assented to.

Strike out the words 'Elkton and Baltimore' wherever they occur in the bill and insert the words 'the Delaware and Maryland.'
