Gentlemen of the Senate,

We return to you the bill entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, and request that your honorable body will reconsider the same, and recede from your 6th and 7th amendments.

The operation of these amendments would directly effect a radical change in the license system, injurious to the revenue, and extremely inconvenient and vexatious to the numerous persons affected by it in the several counties of this state.

Also a resolution relative to the militia officers, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the militia.

And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to authorise the leasing of a lot in the city of Baltimore belonging to the heirs of Kennedy Owen, passed at December session 1827, chapter 211, endorsed 'will pass.'

Also the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act relative to Liberty street in the city of Baltimore, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendment.'

The said amendment which was as follows, was read and assented to.

At the end of the bill add

'Provided, that nothing contained in this act shall take effect unless approved by the mayor and city council of Baltimore.'

Also a bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act relating to insolvent debtors, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments.'

The said amendments which were as follows, were read and assented to.

1st. Strike out the 3d section of the bill.

2d. Strike out the 5th section of the bill and insert in lieu thereof the following.

'And be it enacted, That if on such final appearance or
