They were then severally read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Chapman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act of December session 1827, chapter 117, entitled, an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to.

In the 4th line insert the words 'nor less than eighteen.'

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer submitted the following message, which was read, adopted, and with the bill to which it refers, sent to

the house of delegates.

By the Senate,

March 14, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We beg leave to return to your honorable body, and respectfully submit to you the propriety of reconsidering the bill which you have rejected, entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide a summary mode (as respects the city of Baltimore) of recovering the possession of lands and This bill is of great importance to the rights of landlords as well as of tenants in that city, and for want of the provisions it contains much individual loss and embarrassment is now daily suffered. We trust that it may receive your favorable consideration; and submit it to you again at this protracted period of the session because of the urgent and useful objects it is intended to answer.

As the proceedings of the senate are not published in the newspapers, and we believed that it was important for the
