

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, passed at December session 1825, chapter 58, was read the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred a resolution relative to certain laws, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to.

In the 5th line after the word 'licenses' insert the words 'of ordinary keepers and retailers of spirituous liquors.'

The resolution was then read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Wootton from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to promote internal improvement by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to the city of Washington, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to

At the end of the bill add the following section:

'And be it enacted, That full right and privilege is hereby reserved to the citizens of this state or any company hereafter to be incorporated under authority of this act, to connect with the road hereby provided for, any other rail road leading from the main route to any part or parts of this state.'

The bill was then read the second time.
