The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Wootton, the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to promote internal improvement by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to the city of Washington, with the amendments heretofore reported, was recommitted to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Wootton from the said committee reported that the committee had had said bill again under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

On motion of Mr. Wootton, the amendments heretofore reported were withdrawn.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time and rejected.
