The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of Jeremiah Hughes, which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Mr. Wootton from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to an act to make public an old road leading from Coalsville in Montgomery county to intersect the public road from Vansville in Prince George's county, at or near the Paint Chapel in said county, passed at December session 1823, chapter 184, reported favorably thereon.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate such elections, was read the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Chapman from the committee to which was recommended the bill entitled, an act to facilitate the collection and to improve the revenue of this state, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following bills were postponed until the first day of June next.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the appointment of commissioners for taking acknowledgments of deeds and proof of instruments of writing and affidavits in the several states of the Union.

A bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act to regulate the inspection of tobacco.
