Also the following bill which originated in the senate entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province and limiting the extent of them, endorsed "will pass."

Also the following bill which originated in the senate, entitled an act for the relief of the citizens of Maryland, holding persons of color to service for a term of years and to prevent their absconding, endorsed "will not pass."

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered with the bill to which it refers the following message.

By the House of Delegates,

March 14th, 1832.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message, accompanied by a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the promotion of internal improvement by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to Washington.

The protracted period of the session does not admit of a matured consideration of the modifications suggested by your honorable body, and believing that the bill contains several beneficial provisions, we again send it to you, and request your reconsideration of its contents.
