Resolution November Session 1796.

Whereas by a resolution passed at the last session of the general assembly of Maryland, William Pinkney, William Cooke and Philip Barton Key, Esquires, were appointed commissioners on the part of this state, to meet such commissioners as may be appointed for the same purpose by the commonwealth of Virginia, to settle and adjust, by mutual compact between the two governments, the western and southern limits of this state, and the dividing lines and boundaries between this state and the said commonwealth; and also to settle and adjust as aforesaid, any claim of this state, or the said commonwealth, to territory within the limits of the other: And whereas the said William Pinkney is now absent from this state, and the said William Cooke hath notified to this general assembly that he cannot attend to the execution of the above powers,

Resolved That Charles Carroll of Carrollton, and Jeremiah Townley Chase, Esquires, be and they hereby appointed commissioners on the part of this state, in conjunction with the said Philip Barton Key, for the purposes aforesaid; and the said commissioners are required to report their proceedings in virtue of their appointment and authority, to the general assembly of this state, at the next session after the same shall have been concluded, for confirmation or rejection.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to communicate without delay to the executive of Virginia, this change in the appointment of commissioners on the part of this state.

RESOLUTIONS, Nov. Session, 1801,
