

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates,
January 3d, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose with your concurrence, to refer all that part of the annual message of the Governor, with the accompanying documents, which relates to the proceedings of the late convention of the state of South Carolina, to a joint committee, and have nominated on the part of this House, Messrs. Merrick, Johnson, Harper, Nicols and Wright (of Queen Anne's) as members of said committee.

Also a resolution relative to forwarding to the editors of papers and public journals in this state, printed copies of the daily proceedings of the Senate and House of Delegates, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Claude, Page and Wootton.

Also the following bills:—

A bill entitled, An act to alter and change the name of Luther Baker of the city of Baltimore, to Martin Luther Baker, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Chapman;

A bill entitled, An act to confirm an act entitled, An act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relates to the division of Somerset county into election districts, passed at December session 1831, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Emory and Hughlett;

A bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate Frederick Town, in Frederick county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Page and Montgomery.

On motion of Mr. Mayer the bill entitled "an act supplementary to an act regulating the importation of Green Hides and Skins in the City of Baltimore" was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading. It was accordingly engrossed and, on motion of Mr. Mayer, read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.
