received 62 votes, John S. Stoddart 2 votes, 1 vote was given for John Thomas, and there were 21 blanks.

Whereupon it was declared that Hon. James Thomas having received a majority of all the votes, is duly elected Governor of the state of Maryland for and during the time prescribed by the constitution and form of government.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates,

January 7th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

The honorable James Thomas, of Saint Mary's county, having been elected Governor of Maryland, we propose that a joint letter be addressed to him by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of this House, notifying him of his election, and requesting his attendance at the seat of government, to qualify agreeably to the constitution and form of government of this state, and that the same be forwarded by express.

Mr. Mayer submitted the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,

January 7th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received and concur in your message, proposing that the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Delegates, announce by letter to the honorable James Thomas, his election as Governor of this state, and request his attendance at the seat of government, and that the communication be transmitted by express.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
