Bowie, of Prince George's, Samuel Turner, of Calvert, Thomas E. Worthington, of Frederick, William Potter, of Caroline, and John S. Martin, of Worcester, and have appointed Messrs. Gantt and Hope, to count the ballots and report the result.

Also, a resolution in favour of the Electors of President and Vice-President of the United States; which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Emory, leave was granted to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act to alter the time of the meeting of the General Assembly of this state, and for other purposes:

Ordered, That Messrs. Emory, Claude and Morris be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,

January 8th, 1833

We have received your message proposing to go into the election of a Council to the Governor, this day at 12 o'clock, and concur therein. No other than the gentlemen named by you are put in nomination by the Senate; and we have appointed Messrs. Hughlett and Pigman to join the gentlemen named by you, to count the ballots and report the result.
