

Mr. Page presented the petition of Turpin Wright for authority to remove slaves into this state; which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution in favor of Benjamin Goddard of Prince George's county; which was read the first time and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also a bill entitled, An act to extend the time for taking the bond of the Sheriff of Alleghany County: which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

Mr. Mayer, from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to extend the time for taking the bond of the Sheriff of Alleghany County, reported favourably thereon. It was read the second, and by special order, the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Emory, from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, An act to alter the time of the meeting of the General Assembly of this State and for other purposes: which was read the first time.

Mr. Mayer offered the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,

January 9th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your Message proposing the appointment of a joint committee of your honorable body and of the Senate, to devise some suitable tribute of respect to the memory of the venerated Charles Carroll; and we cordially concur in the proposal. We have appointed on the part of the Senate, to act with the committee of your honorable body, Messrs. Mayer, Claude, Hughlett, Emery and Morris.
