and the blank filled up with the names of Messrs. Claude, Chapman, and Mayer. It was then adopted and sent to the House of Delegates.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.

## THURSDAY, January 10th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, leave was granted to bring in a bill to be entitled, a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act to establish a Bank, and incorporate a company under the name of the Cumberland Bank of Allegany, and to revive the charter of the Cumberland Bank of Allegany.

Ordered that Messrs. Pigman, Mayer, and Hughlett, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Hughlett presented a report from the trustees of the academy at Easton, which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

Mr. Chapman from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution relative to the payment of the members of the present general assembly, and the officers thereof reported favorably thereon. It was read the second, and by special order, the third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bill: a bill entitled an act to repeal in part an act to prohibit the use of gill nets in the Potomac and Patuxent rivers, during the period therein mentioned; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Chapman, Page and Sappington.

Mr. Chapman from the committee on finance, to which was referred a resolution in favor of the electors of President and Vice President of the United States, a resolution in favor of Alexander Robertson, and a resolution in favor of Bushrod W. Marriott, sheriff of Anne
