### FRIDAY January 11th, 1833.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Franklin Savings Company of Baltimore, passed by the Senate on yesterday was sent to the House of Delegates.

The President laid before the Senate a communication from Thomas Culbreth Esq. Clerk of the Council, enclosing an account of the disbursements and expenditures of the Executive, within the last fiscal year—which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a bill entitled, An act to explain an act of Assembly passed at December session 1831, chapter 323, entitled, An act relating to free negroes and slaves; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Chapman, Wootton and Emory.

Mr. Mayer submitted the following report and resolutions, which were read the first time:
