A bill entitled, an act to repeal an act to abolish imprisonment for debt, on certain judgments rendered by justices of the peace, passed at December session, 1830, chapter 155, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings. A bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Savings Institution of Emmittsburgh, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Pigman and Hughlett.

A bill entitled, an act to divorce George Carey, of Worcester county, from his wife Chancey Carey, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Page and Claude.

A bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act for the preservation of Fish, in Allegany county, passed at December session, 1831, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Dennis, and Montgomery, and returned the bill, which originated in the senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Franklin Savings Company of Baltimore, endorsed, "will pass."

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill entitled, an act to revive and continue an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Union Insurance Company of Maryland, was read the third time by special order, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on invalid deeds, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Harford county, to record the deed of manumission therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon. It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.
