The honorable speaker and members of the House of Delegates having retired.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10

o'clock.

FRIDAY, January 18th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The president laid before the senate the following let-

ter, from George Reed, esquire:

Greensborough, January 14th, 1833.

Honorable Benjamin S. Forrest,

Sir:—Owing to severe and protracted indisposition, it will be out of my power to attend at Annapolis, during the present session of the legislature; I therefore forward this my resignation of my seat as senator, with my best respects for yourself, and the honorable body over which you preside.

I remain very respectfully your obedient servant, GEORGE REED.
