passed at December session, 1831, chapter 323, entitled, "An act relating to free negroes and slaves," with the amendments heretofore reported; was sideration, when on motion of Mr. Dennis, it was postponed and made the order of the day for Wednesday next, the 23d instant.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act vesting certain powers in the president of the United States, which was read the first time.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.

TUESDAY, January 22d, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act relating to a certain deed therein mentioned, was read the third time, and passed.

The clerk of the House of Delegates, delivered the following messages:

By the House of Delegates, January 22, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We sent you a message on the nineteenth, proposing to go into the election of Bank Directors on the part of the state, for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, on this day, we now propose with the concurrence of your honorable body, to proceed on Tuesday next, at twelve o'clock, to the election of Bank Directors, on the part of the state, in the several banks in which the state is entitled to a director.
