And the bill entitled, an act to correct an error, and make valid a deed from John Hicks and wife, to Jeremiah Marshall of Dorchester county; the bill entitled, an act to divorce George Carey of Worcester county, from his wife Nancey Carey; the bill entitled, "an act to repeal an act for the preservation of Fish in Allegany county," passed at December session, 1831, and the bill entitled, an act relating to a certain deed therein mentioned, also severally passed by the senate on yesterday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Jacob Harris, reported favorably thereon. It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and refurned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,
