And whereas several deeds of bargain and sale have been executed prior to the passage of an act entitled an act relating to the people of color in this state, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 281, conveying certain slaves for a limited period to the bargainess therein mentioned, and after the expiration of said period, declaring said slaves free which deeds have been neither attested by two witnesses, or been recorded prior to the passage of said act whereby such slaves are deprived of the benefits intended by said deeds.

Be it enacted, that such deeds shall be as valid as if they had been attested according to law, and recorded

prior to the passage of said act.

On motion of Mr. Pigman the said bill, together with the proposed amendments were recommitted to Messrs. Wootton, Emory, Sappington, Pigman and Dennis.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 e'clock.
