Mr. Morris presented the memorial of the proprietors of the Susquehanna Canal, praying for the privilege of purchasing and holding land not exceeding five hundred acres, which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

FRIDAY, January 25th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, and act to amend the act entitled, "an act to make valid the instrument of writing therein mentioned, the bill entitled, an act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to alter the width of a part of Canal, formerly Harford street, of a part of Spring street, of a part of Strawberry Alley, and to close Russell Lane, and the bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Dorchester county, to appoint an additional Constable in the town of Cambridge in said county, severally passed by the senate on yesterday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution in favor of James Watts, a soldier of the revolution which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also a bill entitled, an act to change the name of James Michael, of Harford county, to James Johnson, which was read the first-time, and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Hughlett and Pigman.

Also a bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Dorchester county, to purchase a piece of land for the repairs of a public causeway in said county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Emory and Sappington.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill entitled, an act to
