SATURDAY, January 26th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution in favor of John McElroy, principal of St. John's Literary Institution in Frederick, assented to by the senate on yesterday, was returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the petition of Andrew Hook, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Andrew Hook, late of the city of Baltimore, which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the petition of Charles R. Barney, and others, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the closing up of a
