a part of Dawson Alley, in the city of Baltimore, was read the third time, by special order, and passed.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution in favor of George Pearce, of Warren county, Kentucky, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Hagerstown Savings Institution, in Washington county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Pigman, Sappington and Mayer.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the petition of William W. Handy and Thomas A. Spence, reported a bill entitled, an act for the completion of a certain trust therein mentioned, which was read the first time.

Mr. Mayer from the committee, to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate descents, which was read the first time.

The senate adjourned until Monday Morning, 10 o'clock.

MONDAY, January 28th, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Page appeared in the Senate and took his seat.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Dorchester county, to purchase a piece of land for the repairs of a public causeway, in said county, passed by the Senate on Saturday, was returned to the House of Delegates.

And the bill entitled, An act to authorise the closing up of a part of Scott street, and a part of Dawson Alley, in the city of Baltimore, and the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Eastern Savings Company, also severally passed by the Senate on Saturday, were sent to the House of Delegates.
