Mr. Morris presented the petition of certain inhabitants of Williamsport, in Washington county, in aid of the petition of Susan F. Williams, and Anne Williams, relative to the sale of certain real estate, which was read and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following message, which was read and adopted:

By the Senate,

January 29th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,
