

FRIDAY, February 1st, 1833.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The memorial of the governors and visitors of St. John's College, referred yesterday by the Senate to the consideration of the House of Delegates, was sent

And the bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a new road in Frederick and Baltimore counties, passed on yesterday

And the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Hagerstown Savings Institution in Washington county, also passed with certain amendments on yesterday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee to which was recommitted the bill entitled, an act to regulate descents, reported that the committee had had said bill again under consideration, and had instructed him to ask leave to withdraw said bill, and to report a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to amend and reduce into one system the laws to direct descents, which was read the first time.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the town of Sharpsburgh, and Miller's addition to Sharpsburgh, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Emory and Page.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the trustees of Saint Patricks' Church, in the city of Baltimore, to hold certain property, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Morris, Montgomery and Dennis.

A bill entitled, an act relating to Parkin street in the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Morris, Hughlett and Claude.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the recording of certain deeds therein mentioned, and for other purposes, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.
